#### <u>Literacy Programme</u>

All classes will run daily reading, spelling, grammar, creative and expressive writing, and oral language programmes, continuing to develop skills learnt in previous years but with the focus on developing student's independence in literacy.

This term the syndicate will focus on persuasive language where we will look at how to get people to look at our points of view and will lead into learning the skills of debating. We do apologise for encouraging your young preteen to argue and hope that you are not exposed to too much practice! We will be holding an interclass debating competition which will lead into our Debate Cup Final.

#### <u>Maths</u>

**This term we will cover -** (Classroom Planning to cover all objectives – timing varies according to student need.)

**NUMBER KNOWLEDGE & STRATEGIES:** Know the relative size & place value structure of positive & negative integers & decimals to three places

**GEOMETRY: Shape -** Identify classes of two & three dimensional shapes by their geometric properties. Relate three-dimensional models to two-dimensional representations, vice versa.

**Position & Location -** Communicate & interpret locations & directions, using compass directions, distance, & grid references.

Most classes will also be continuing their Personalised Learning Programmes and will spend a lot of time revising maths concepts learnt throughout the year.

# <u>Inquiry - Term 3's school wide focus is "What is your Superpower?"</u> This will continue through Term 4 as we were unable to complete this due to Lockdown

After creating our own Super heros with special super powers each student will take a more serious look at what their actual super power is. If they could make a difference to anything they wanted to, what would they do, how could they do this and what difference they could make?

Through this Inquiry, we hope the students will realise that what they do has impact and that they CAN make a difference to something they are passionate about.

#### Physical Education

Fitness programmes developed in Term 1 will continue throughout this term encouraging students to strive towards their own goals and targets and make adjustments to these targets and activities to ensure students are continuously improving their fitness.

This term we will focus on athletics in preparation for our own syndicate Athletics Day from which we will select representatives to compete at Interschool Athletics. Our Syndicate Athletics Day will be on Wednesday 3rd November with events starting just after 9am till Lunchtime. The afternoon will be Class relay events. You are more than welcome to pop along and cheer on your favourite athlete.

We will also use summer sports to encourage teamwork, sportsmanship and inclusiveness, and hopefully some fun in the sunshine!

#### The Arts and Languages

**Te Reo** - Turangawaewae Projects and the online Toku Reo and Education Perfect progammes will continue throughout the year with a big focus on using everyday phrases and instructions as much as possible.

Visual Art, Dance and Music - Will all be linked into our Inquiries.

Students have all been invited to put together a portfolio of art or writing for the Writer's and Art Cups so please encourage your child to do this if they have particular strengths in either of these areas. They will need to submit 3 unnamed pieces of different genres for each Cup by November 6th.
