
This is a great space for sharing whole class and individual posts of learning and activities. Students can upload photos and write for their Blog, as well as the teachers. (It's a bit like seesaw)

Students must charge their devices at home.


Do not add extensions and apps to the device unless it is a useful tool for learning and approved by the teacher (extensions and apps can really slow the computer down and are often a big distraction).

Health and PE - Swimming and Water Safety - The emphasis of the Kiwi Swim Safe Programme is on supporting the students to become more confident in the water and improve their awareness of water safety issues as they work on their swimming style and technique.

English - We will be completing a range of literacy learning through reading, writing, speaking and presenting. Lots of research and inquiry will take place through our unit on Health and Wellbeing.

Mathematics

The main online maths platforms that we are using this year are E-Ako and Khan Academy. Maths is taught within home classrooms or across the hubs.

<u>Homelearning</u>

We encourage you to read with your children or have them reading daily for pleasure as part of their home-learning.

Students may be asked to complete unfinished work in their own time or they may even feel inspired to pursue further learning carried over from school to home.
