


PS. We left off tissues on the stationery list but would welcome any donations of a **box of tissues** for the term.

What is in the @school App? **Learning Space**






When the teacher has seen that your child has achieved success at the assigned goals they will mark them as achieved.

Our Learning:

Over the first twos terms our school inquiry focus will be on Health & Wellbeing "How we can look after ourselves". We will also be looking at traditional tales stemming from our learning of Matariki.

Values - Focus on the CREST Values - Curiosity, Respect, Excellence, Self Management, Team Work

Health and PE - Fitness, Cross Country, Winter Sports

English - We will be completing a range of literacy learning through reading, writing, speaking and presenting. Lots of research and inquiry will take place through our unit on Health and PE and Traditional Tales. Oral Language will become a focus going into Term 3 whereby students will retell a traditional tale to their classmates through storytelling.
