LEARNING THROUGH PLAY


Learning Through Play is an activity-based programme which provides students opportunities to explore, create and problem solve, in a fun, student-directed, authentic context. Learning Through Play is another way children can also develop their oral language skills by practising their conversation and negotiation skills as well as our school CREST values.

Ngaru classes will have Learning Through Play sessions every fortnight on a Friday afternoon.

HOME READING

One way in which you can help your child get better at reading is through lots of practice. By hearing your child read aloud at home each day, you can help them improve. Your child could ask someone to listen to them read, it could be a brother, sister, parent, grandparent or even the cat!

Reading is an invaluable life skill and we encourage whānau to hear their child read regularly (15-20 minutes daily) to supplement what we do in school as it makes a real difference. Little and often is far better than one long extended reading session. It is

Our values at PBS are the foundations to positive behaviour and developing life skills. We have defined what these values mean to us at PBS.



NGARU OVERVIEW OF LEARNING FOR TERM ONE

MATHEMATICS

Number Knowledge: Know the forward and backward counting sequences with whole numbers to at least 1000. Know how many ones, tens, and hundreds are in whole numbers to at least 1000. Using simple adding strategies using whole numbers. Follow, find, and create number and shape patterns, following a rule.



Measurement - Create and use appropriate units and devices to measure area, volume and capacity.

Statistics - Ask a question about everyday situations, survey and collect data, record and sort information, create a simple graph and make statements about findings.

Classroom Reading Programmes including Structured Literacy aimed at your child's needs and knowledge.



Oral Language Experiences and News to expand knowledge of words.


Please download our school app – @school Mobile – to your phone. This app can keep you updated on your child's progress, and all that is happening at school.

If you haven't logged in before - we can email you with information about the app. The first email you receive about the app will contain your USERNAME.

It will look something like this: 2874/1234/5678 (this is just an example, your number will be different)

In the email will be a long link in blue text – these are the terms and conditions. Once you click the link and agree to the terms and conditions, another email will be sent to you.

The second email you receive will contain your PASSWORD. You can change the password to something else when you log in the first time.

Copy your USERNAME and PASSWORD into the app.
