

PARAPARAUMU BEACH SCHOOL PRIZE GIVING AWARDS

Over the years PBS has been gifted a number of cups/trophies from departing student families or staff members. Below is a list of these along with our standard school awards that are presented at the end of each school year either during our final whole school assembly or at senior prizegiving. The award recipients are determined according to the stated criteria for each award and the judgements are made by those best placed in relation to what the award is for e.g. classroom teachers, senior management or coaches.

- ❖ All students who meet the criteria will be considered.
- ❖ The best student(s) from this initial pool of students will then receive the award.
- ❖ Students can receive more than one award.
- ❖ Our school CREST values are also part of the criteria.
- ❖ Occasionally certain awards may not be presented due to event's or opportunities not being held or students not meeting the award criteria.
